I have designed the session to feature a variety of conversation and learning formats that engage both introverted and extroverted learners and to model ones you might valuable for use in your own efforts.





Leading in a VUCA World

"What is your work?" Few questions require as much clarity for association executives as this one. Calibrating your intentions and attention in a VUCA world begins with stepping back and reconnecting to the fundamentals.

Purpose: Start with Why

Over time an association's what unintentionally can overtake its why: what it does becomes its reason for existence, potentially resulting in efforts being somewhat divorced from the purpose or value for which they were created.

Thinking in Systems

Systems thinking focuses on the way that elements of your VMA interrelate, how your internal systems work over time, and how your association interacts in the larger ecosystem of veterinary medicine and professional associations.

Preparing for the Futures

While we cannot always predict *the* future, we can better prepare for *possible* futures using scenarios planning to explore critical unknowns that hold dramatic implications for your association's ability to serve and succeed.
