## Power of Ten Committee

Role and Responsibilities

## Committee role

The Power of Ten (P10) Committee is appointed to review the impact of the Power of Ten program and to identify opportunities for VMAE to expand its support of the program. VMAE desires to enhance program vibrancy and to identify mechanisms that can connect and nourish program alumni.

## Committee responsibilities

- Identify how many VMAs have P10 programs, both active and inactive
- Calculate the number of graduates nationally that have completed a P10 program and develop summary statements of impact and outcomes
- Consider how VMAE might update P10 content offering ideas for its members, including gathering ideas from P10 programs on how they have enhanced or redefined their curricula over time
- Collect ideas from P10 programs that have developed ways to stay connected to program alumni and identify ways that VMAE might support such connections
- Discuss how the committee and VMAE can continue to be impactful in keeping P10 alive and thriving
- Prepare a summary report, including any recommended actions, for review and action by the Board of Directors and, at the board's discretion, for subsequent sharing with VMAE members


## Committee composition

The Power of Ten Committee shall be comprised of at least five members appointed by the president, one of whom shall be appointed to serve as chair. VMAE desires to have committee members who reflect a variety of VMA attributes including geographic scope, membership size, species and specialties, employment settings, and length of CEO tenure. Desired attributes of committee members include contributing creative ideas, evaluating program curricula, developing an action plan, and working collaboratively with other VMA executives.

The chair shall serve a one-year term with a maximum of four consecutive terms. Committee members shall serve one-year terms and are eligible for re-appointment to additional one-year terms with a maximum of four consecutive terms. Terms shall expire after one year or the association's annual meeting, whichever occurs first.

The work of the committee is supported by the CEO and the association manager.
