We will make a final stop at the picturesque Square Saint-Louis, framed by brightly painted Victorian homes, and discover a hidden green alley tucked away nearby.

The return route takes us through the lively Quartier des spectacles, Montréal's cultural heartbeat, before arriving back at the Humaniti Hotel. Throughout the tour, our guide will share engaging stories, history, and local insight, giving us a richer appreciation of this dynamic city.
